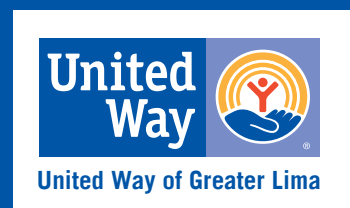


# Our United Way **HEROES!**

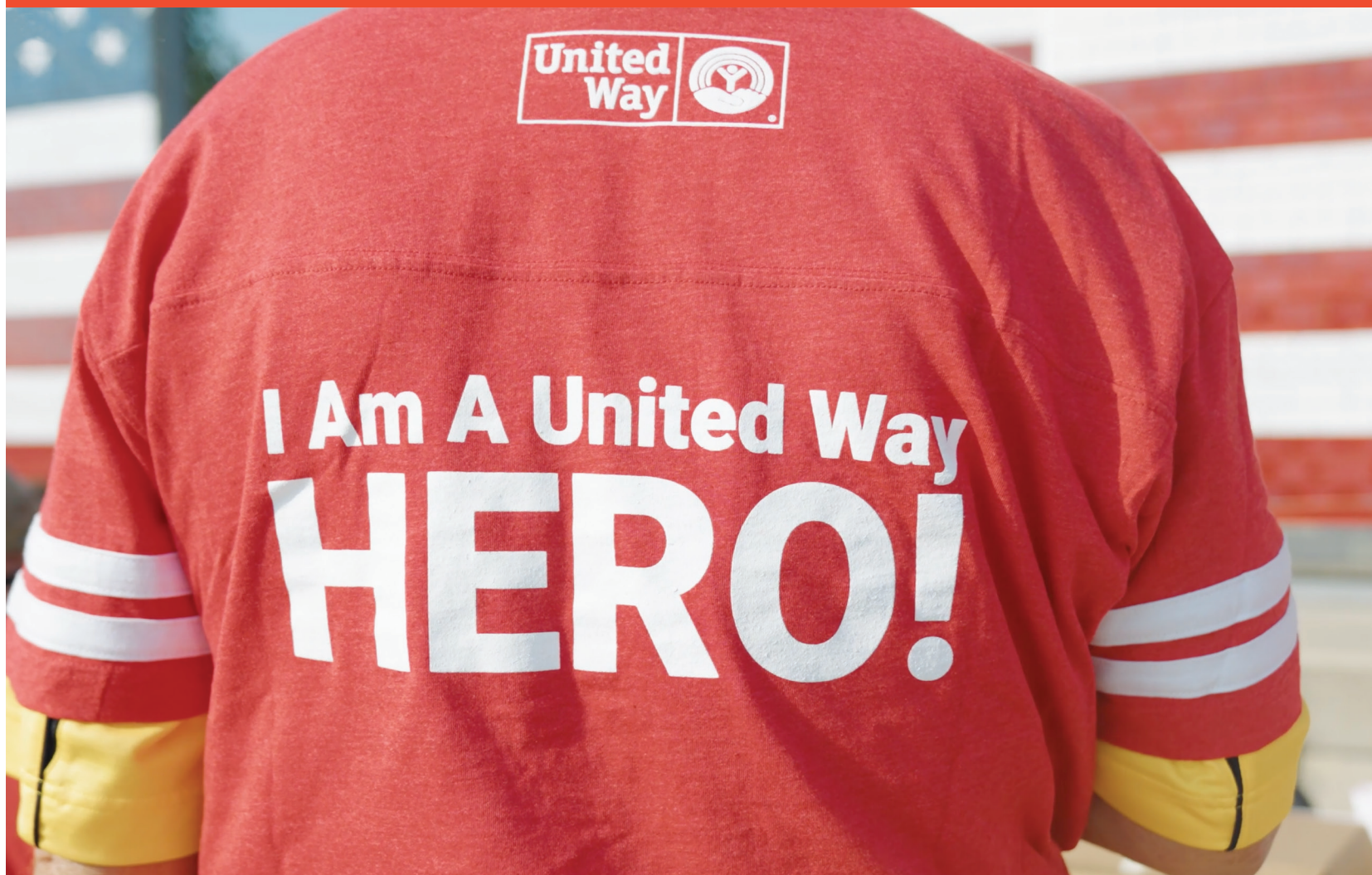
